ABOUT THE TEACHER:

My name is Mr. Lyons. I teach 7th and 8th grade English and a class of 8th grade Bible at OCSI. I've been living in Okinawa since 2018. ABOUT THE COURSE:

The grade 8 Bible curriculum is general study into the New Testament books of the Bible. Students will focus on understanding the entire narrative of scripture and where the New Testament books fit into God's unfolding story. They will walk through the life of Christ in the Gospels and understand how the life, death, resurrection, and ascension of Christ affected the early church by studying Acts of the Apostles and the Epistles. The course will encourage student participation in studying, reflecting, and applying the Bible. Special attention will be given to integrating God's Word into the student's life for the sake of their spiritual formation.
