Writing

Students will be able to write argumentative, informational, and narrative texts, maintaining style and format appropriate to 8th grade standards.

- 1. **Narrative Writing:** To develop narratives with clear plotlines, meaningful characterization, purposeful symbols, and central themes. Students will develop their ability to use voice, tone, and mood in their writing.
- 2. **Research/Argumentative Writing:** To research public issues with the intention of correcting a problem for the benefit of society. Students will be able to find reliable evidence, identify bias, and cite their evidence in MLA format.
- 3. **Poetry:** To creatively express one's culture with the use of intentional language, poetic devices, and personal experiences.
- 4. **Language:** To express their God-given, personal creativity through proper English grammar, conventions, and figurative language.

Speaking and Listening

Students will be able to discuss a wide variety of issues relevant to 8th grade, present products professionally, and communicate appropriately according to 8th grade standards.

- 1. **Discussion:** To come to class prepared for discussions, ask appropriate questions that deepen the discussion, and act appropriately when discussing.

ROUTINES

Journals

- Students will be required to respond to journal prompts that will address a wide range of topics and assess a wide range of topics, encouraging them to write and reflect on their lives.

<u>Grammar</u>

- Students will address a new grammar concept every 2 weeks. At the start of each week, students will receive the online lessons needed to fill out the guided notes, practice sentences and any additional assessments. Grammar will always be due at the end of the week and quizzes will be given at the end of a 2 week cycle.

Vocabulary

 Students will build their vocabulary by developing strategies to determine the meaning of unknown or multiple meaning words.

Independent Reading

- Students will participate in independent reading through the Accelerated Reader program offered by Renaissance Learning, Inc. This program provides reading levels that match student's abilities and progresses as they progress.

POLICY

Classroom Library

- Students may check out any book on Mr. Lyons' class bookshelves, but they must use the booksource program on their chromebooks. Books may be checked out 2 at a time. Students are responsible for returning all of Mr. Lyons' class books back to the class by the end of the year. If books are lost, damaged, or not returned, students will be responsible for the cost of replacing the book.

Chromebooks

- Students are expected to show respect by only viewing what is necessary for English class during class time. If chromebooks are not charged for class, students will be marked as unprepared.

Homework

- Homework is expected to be turned in at the start of class on the day it is due. Homework should not under any circumstances be accomplished during another class period or during lessons in English 7. Homework that is not turned in at the start of class will be marked as late unless stated otherwise.

Preparation
